TK Charity – 3v3 tournament April 27!



- April 17 status: 1 team signed (a NOW team)
- NASC: 4 teams (not sure what age)
- NOW Soccer: 4 teams (not sure until registered)
- Hampton Cove Pride (HCP): 2 teams
- Potential for 10-12 teams (\$30 per game for refs 3 games per team... about 24 games... \$720ish)
- Deadline of April 20th for registrations
- Herbert/Jacob to meet on April 21st
 - If a "go", will need medals ordered etc...
 - If a "no-go" will refund teams
 - Either way, getting the word out for a delay.
 - Herbert will work the no-cost for fields/lighting
 - Referee's: cost? Who? John (coach) with UAH about potential for players to ref (less than certified refs)?
- Jacob to plan where we need volunteer support.

Filling out International NGO



- Herbert/John: Stop by police for "good conduct" form.
- John: Form A partially filled out
- Uganda actions required:
 - Timothy will need to go get certificate of incorporation (permit)
 - Time limit: 1 month from pickup permit (payment) to get certificate (data protection office)
- Wait for next year due to the timing of permit. So we get "ready" and wait till next year to start the paperwork. Potentially 2025.

TK Charity – Ronald's Opportunity to join TK



Ronald

- Currently an Academy organization, he wants to change to a charity. Same goals as TK Soccer Charity: give back to the community
- In Uganda, Ronald's players come from poor families (majority). Ronald's staff learns about the family and helps them get into school if needed.
- Make joining "free" to align with TK Soccer Charity goals/mission.
- Locations are different than Timothy, but in Uganda
- Current costs (jerseys/equipment/3 coaches/games/transport): will be free services
- Ronald lives in Boston
- Certification of coaches is required in some instances in Uganda. Ronald working to get them certified
- 100+ players, U9, U12, U15, U18 (all boys)
- Building a girls team w/ female coach (7 girls)
- A team "manager" is in Uganda to help w/logistics/facilitate
- Idea discussed if Ronald's organization joins TK Soccer Charity: If someone wants to pay... then they would "donate" to charity as they see fit.
- What happens if operating costs exceed budget? Ronald says that the coaches will work for free.
- Veo sports cameras sometimes used to keep up w/ games and coaching (video streamed to US).

Timothy of TK Soccer Charity for comparison:

- 45 kids
- We don't turn away kids, even troubled kids
- Future goal of requiring some type of certification for ability to be w/ kids and help kids
- Is "counseling" an option for kids or a skill some support staff have?
